LAFCU OPENS NOMINATIONS FOR MILITARY SALUTES AT LUGNUTS GAMES

Active, veteran military members to be honored

LANSING, Mich. — LAFCU's Community Champions program is now accepting public nominations for active and veteran members of the military to be honored at Lansing Lugnuts games this summer.

"This is the second year that we've used the opportunity of our Fireworks Spectaculars to shine the spotlight on individuals who have selflessly sacrificed for our great country," said Kelli A.
